(Some things students can do NOW to develop a clearer picture of their future.)

There are three activities in this Worksheet:

- Activity 1. Actions to make the Work Inspiration experience count!
- Activity 2. Develop your career development statement
- Activity 3. Create your personal career board

**Learning Outcome** **Activity 1.**

To ensure students achieve an ongoing benefit from Work Inspiration. Students will be more motivated to achieve results if they see how the value of what they are learning relates to their overall school experience. These experiences will help prepare them for their future study or career.

**Timing** Post Work Inspiration program – via Facebook Group

**Procedure** The Worksheet "Beyond Work Inspiration" can be provided to students either by the organising teacher or through a Work Inspiration Facebook Group by the Host Employer (or Industry) where this facility is being used. See Resource 4, "Other ideas" for Facebook Group instructions.
